Strand Hardware made its mark and completed UKCA compliancy a year ahead of schedule.



Certifications for all Panic Hardware ranges – 290 products in total – were in place for the original January 2023 deadline but because so many companies were not ready the Government extended the completion date to lune 2025

However, all of Strand's panic hardware products now bear the UKCA mark under the new 'harmonised/designated standard'. The required Declaration of Performance (DOPs) and fitting instructions are available on our website for download.

Hitting the **Headlines**

Strand Hardware's 'expert voice' is now regularly seen across the trade press underpinning our growing presence as a 'go to' company with years of valuable experience.

Recent features have included a two-page spread in Door Industry Journal around specifying the right hardware for emergency exit and panic doors – highlighting the difference between manual and electrical options for panic and emergency environments.

Another insight piece on how natural ventilation could be achieved on a budget with manual closers, was commissioned by ABC&D Magazine. Both features were published in July.

Setting the **Bar Higher**

Customer service is what sets Strand Hardware apart from its competitors – for 32 years we've gone above and beyond - providing technical advice and expertise, with fast and efficient service.

But we never rest on our laurels: every year we measure our performance against rigorous targets to 'add value' to the client experience.

Last year, we achieved a **99.54%** on time, in full (OTIF) average for our orders - exceeding our **98% target**. We also had:

- Minimal processing errors below our 0.5% orders received target.
- Minimal order packing errors below our 0.5% orders received target.
- A total of 'all concerns raised' less than 2% against all orders received.

Strand's annual client survey also identified a 100% company recommendation rating and 100% rating of products, quality, and reliability – the same or better than competitors

The company also had no major non-conformance reports (NCR) raised by British Assessment Bureau during its annual audit,

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Embracing the Elements: Strand Hardware Celebrates New Offices

Earlier this year, we welcomed guests to a rededication ceremony at Strand House following an ambitious makeover of our head office. With perfect timing, the event coincided with a visit from the 'Beast from the East' - a sudden snowfall which cloaked the West Midlands – but undeterred the majority of our guests arrived: from Germany and across the UK, including loyal customers, dedicated suppliers, and members of the media.

Revolutionising the Workspace

The building underwent a radical revamp, during which the team 'kept calm and carried on' over the noise of building work, constant upheaval and endless settling of dust. The programme of works was completed over 31 weeks, resulting in a modern, open plan work space with hi-tech reception and improved energy efficiency.

Many of the materials used in the project were sourced from suppliers and clients including new windows, fire doors, electricals, plumbing, furniture, decoration, carpeting and signage, along with some Strand's own ironmongery products.

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Honouring a Legacy

More than 70 guests attended the March event including Reiner Wiese and Baabitha from our finger protection supplier, Athmer, who travelled from Arnsberg in Germany, and Simon Forrester, Chief Executive Officer of the Guild of Architectural Ironmongers.

Ironically, one of the 'no shows' was the Mayor of Walsall, who was due to preside over the ribbon-cutting ceremony. Instead, our very own VIP, Christine Franks, wife of company founder, the late Jonathan Franks, did the honours.

This little twist of fate provided a heartwarming and fitting moment:

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"I know that Jonathan would have been extremely proud to see how Strand Hardware has flourished," she said before cutting through the crimson ribbon.

Guests were treated to refreshments and goody bags and a special cake was created to mark the event.



In his speech, Managing Director Steve Marshall, said: "The completion of the refurbishment project took many months of planning, organisation, disruption and hard work from all concerned. Those who had visited us before will no doubt see a vast improvement in our working environment, and our environmental credentials."

"Since the dear late Mr Jonathan Franks set up the company in 1991, Strand Hardware has gone from strength-to-strength, navigating its way through many national and global challenges, while always sitting solidly on its impeccable financial foundations."

He paid tribute to Strand's 'family' – its 21-strong workforce and Jonathan's daughter, Catherine Franks who took over as MD in 2005 and now Chairs the board.

"She has positioned Strand as one of the market leaders in our industry with customer service levels that are second to none and a reputation of which we can be proud," he added.





Warehouse Improvements Boost Efficiency

For many companies, the warehouse is the 'engine room' of its business operations and Strand is no exception, so we were delighted to undertake a project with a team from Warwick University which helped us develop leaner assembly, dispatch and warehousing processes – saving hundreds of staff hours each year.

WMG (Warwick Manufacturing Group) optimised our warehouse layout to improve movement for the efficient flow of picking, assembly and packing. It involved time and motion analysis through site visits, video capture and process flow assessment. Findings outlined cycle times and mapped the movement of people.

The resulting report outlined a series of recommendations to improve process capacity, including quick wins and minor modifications to warehouse and workstations layout to introduce time savings.

Kanban shelving was introduced into the assembly area to allow components to be picked more efficiently. The doublesided racks are then restocked by one of the team who conveys stock from the warehouse to the assembly stations.

Steve Marshall, Managing Director, said: "Having experts come into the business with fresh pairs of eyes, ask the right questions and with the knowledge to assess and analyse our operations was invaluable. In the long term, this will make our business leaner and more efficient – the ideal foundation for future growth."

The project was undertaken with funding from the Digital Innovation for Manufacturing programme.

Warehouse and Production Manager Andy Michel said: "The results will make the job easier for many of the team and help Strand Hardware in its continuous improvement."

Added Chris Wang, of WMG SME Group: "WMG and Strand Hardware worked collaboratively to analyse its current assembly area in readiness for optimising production. The recommendations should achieve a 50% reduction in cycle times per unit and a 5.105% capacity increase."









Strand Tech Extends Product Range

Strand Technologies is now a UK distributor for two leading international brands – Ditec and AES Global.

Italian-based Ditec is a worldwide market leader and manufacturer of swing and sliding gate operating equipment, and traffic barrier systems. AES Global, based in Northern Ireland, produces innovative security technology including wireless intercom for gates and entrances.

Both partnerships are ideally aligned to Strand Tech which was founded to spearhead our own technology solutions for the safety, security and control of electromechanical operating systems, including automatic doors and entrances.

Ditec products were the first to be introduced outside our own manufacture. They boast a stylish aesthetic with advanced technology for reliability and ease of use. Its entrance systems are energy efficient – enabling users to make energy savings while reducing environmental impact.

Strand is stocking products from its sliding and swing gate range. This includes: Cross, Ion and Neos model operators for sliding gates, and Cubic, PWR, Arc and Facil for swing gates. We are also stocking the Qik range for automatic traffic barriers and a range of accessories.

Ditec automatic barriers are perfect for shopping centres, hotels, residential blocks and public areas which need safe, efficient and reliable access control. They are ideal for sites with medium to high traffic volume.

The AES Global's DECT 603 wireless Intercom series was more recently introduced. It includes the IMP/ HF-IMP, AB/ABK and AS/ASK. All products have a 400m (open field) to 200m (exterior concrete, brick or stone wall) working range and with keypad options available alongside tag and card. The AS/ASK version is made from 100% BS316 marine grade stainless steel – ideal for costal areas - with a modern curved profile with wall back lighting effect.
